PARTNERSHIP MAKES SPLASH FOR SUMMER SWIMMING PROGRAM

YMCA of Greater Erie to run summer recreational swimming program at Rodger Young Swimming Pool

Erie, PA - A rising number of children can look forward to excruciatingly boring school breaks this year as budget crises in places such as New York, Washington, D.C., Houston and Detroit rob them of the activities and programs that have long defined summer in the city for urban youngsters. Swimming pools are being closed. Recreation centers are locking their doors. Library summer reading programs are suffering. Openings for short-term jobs have evaporated. In the City of Erie, collaborative public-private partnerships fund a very full summer of recreational programming throughout City of Erie parks (http://www.erie.pa.us/pdf/2011_city_recreation_guide.pdf).

Today, in a joint announcement among the City of Erie, the Housing Authority of the City of Erie, and the YMCA of Greater Erie, officials told neighborhood kids and families that the Rodger Young Swimming Pool would open again this summer for recreational swimming – and, be open five weeks longer than before.

"We welcome the YMCA of Greater Erie as a community partner in this endeavor and look forward to an extended summer swim program at the Rodger Young Pool. Erie's youth will benefit from the generosity the Housing Authority of the City of Erie and our affiliation with the YMCA," says City of Erie Mayor Joseph E. Sinnott.

The Rodger Young Swimming Pool is set to open on Tuesday, June 14 from 12-5 p.m. and will be open regularly Monday-Saturday, 12-5 p.m. YMCA staff is hosting a Meet & Greet BBQ and swimmer registration tonight, Monday, June 13 from 4-7 p.m. The pool will remain open through Aug. 20.

"We have over 500 children under the age of 18 that live within walking distance of the Rodger Young Swimming Pool," says Housing Authority of the City of Erie Executive Director John Horan. "Swimming is a summer pastime they enjoy."

The Rodger Young Pool Open Swim program offers youth through 18 years old open, free, recreational swimming in a safe and guarded environment.

All swimmers must be registered and will take a swimming skills test to gauge the swimmer's abilities. Swimmers under the age of 6 years old must be accompanied by an adult in the water; parents of swimmers ages 6 & 7 must present birth certificate.
